The Naval Hospital Okinawa, Japan MedCOI enclave architecture consists of hardware, software, and telecommunications systems. The enclave includes user interfaces such as workstations and laptops and hosts office automation as well as medical systems and applications. NH Okinawa MEDCOI is based on Microsoft Windows Active Directory (AD) and Windows 10 and server 2008R2/2012/2016/2019 technology; consisting of End User Devices, Server, Switches, Multi-Function Devices, network printers and VTC.  Personally Identifiable Information (PII) may be collected, maintained, processed, or disseminated by systems and applications within the enclave or documents stored on file servers and shared drives. PII may include PII including employee and beneficiary contact information, military information, demographic information, Social Security Number (SSN), and Protected Health Information (PHI). Commercial-Off-The-Shelf (COTS) applications such as Microsoft Word Excel, PowerPoint, and Outlook are utilized to provide administrative support to the enclave and may process PII.
