The HERMES System (HS) is an image processing and management system for Nuclear Medicine and Positron Emission Tomography (PET). It provides the functions of image display, analysis, processing, communication and storage for the day-to-day clinical functions of the department. The HS v5.6 comprises servers and workstations.  The servers communicate with other nodes on the network for receiving the Personally Identifiable Information (PII) and Protected Health						
Information (PHI) using the protocol Digital Imaging and Communications in Medicine (DICOM). The workstations allow the end user to access the server functions and to also perform image display, analysis and processing for the images in the clinical Nuclear Medicine and PET. There is no use of a mobile application.						
HS v5.6 uses PII and PHI. It receives PII and PHI from Composite Health Care System (CHCS). This information includes: personal information, address, patient identification (ID), telephone number, and medical record number (via SSN).						
The HERMES system is hosted on the Fort Belvoir Community Hospital (FBCH) Network. Hermes is owned and operated by the Defense Health Agency (DHA).
