The MTF Enclave will adopt and inherit higher level security controls, when and where possible, from the Defense Health Agency's (DHA's) enterprise network. The MTF Enclave is an enclave within the DHA network. The rationale for the clear division of boundary scope from the parent network will be to realize the unique and demanding levels of service and regulatory compliances that are uniquely imposed on medical operations and the need for specialized on-site staff to address these demands with clear lines of demarcation between the two. PII processed on some system components, applications, and documents might utilize specific administrative, physical, and technical security controls to protect PII confidentiality and which may be addressed in separate PIAs.
