The system will be used for anyone who is eligible for care within the Military Health System (MHS), including active duty personnel, retirees, and dependents. CyberLOG is responsible for the Risk Management Framework (RMF) process, and gaining an approval from the Defense Health Agency J6 Risk Management Executive Division (DHA J6 RMED). Local sites are responsible for day to day operations, maintenance, and management of the system. Sites are responsible for ensuring AeroDR is configured to meet CyberLOG and RMED approved configurations.
