

Joint Trauma and Education Training Delivery Platform (JTETDP) FACT SHEET

JTETDP, commonly referred to as Deployed Medicine, delivers standardized medical readiness training across the Department of Defense and partner nations via a web-based application. The platform offers instruction in Tactical Combat Casualty Care (TCCC), ensuring both active duty and reserve personnel are trained, ready, and capable of treating injured personnel in support of operational forces worldwide.

Personnel can access Deployed Medicine from any location. In addition to TCCC training, they can receive instruction on Prolonged Casualty Care and Surgical Combat Casualty Care. The Joint Trauma System publishes and maintains content, ensuring current, comprehensive, and detailed training resources are available to users.

Deployed Medicine supports 150,000 users worldwide, and improves medical readiness training across the DOD. It is the only approved distribution source for TCCC content.
